Domestic violence is the willful intimidation, physical assault, battery, sexual assault, and/or other abusive behavior perpetrated by an intimate partner against another. It is an epidemic affecting individuals in every community, regardless of age, economic status, race, religion, nationality, or educational background. Violence against women is often accompanied by emotionally abusive and controlling behavior, and thus is part of a systematic pattern of dominance and control. Domestic violence can cross generations and truly last a lifetime.

Did you know?

- One in every four women will experience domestic violence in her lifetime
- An estimated 1.3 women are victims of physical assault by an intimate partner each year
- 85% of domestic violence victims are women
- Historically, females have been most victimized by someone they knew
- Females who are 20-24 years of age are at the greatest risk of nonfatal intimate partner violence
- Most cases of domestic violence are never reported to the police
